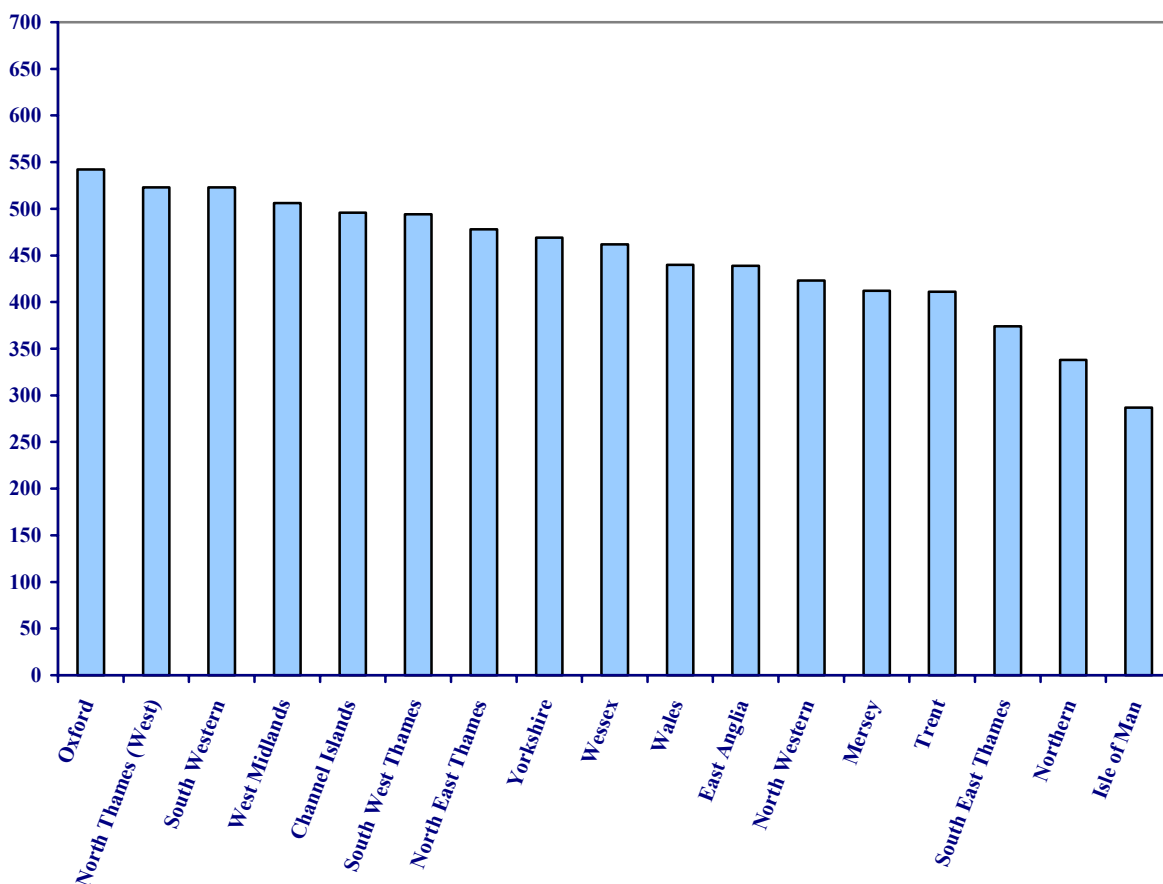

## Number of Deliveries per NHS WTE



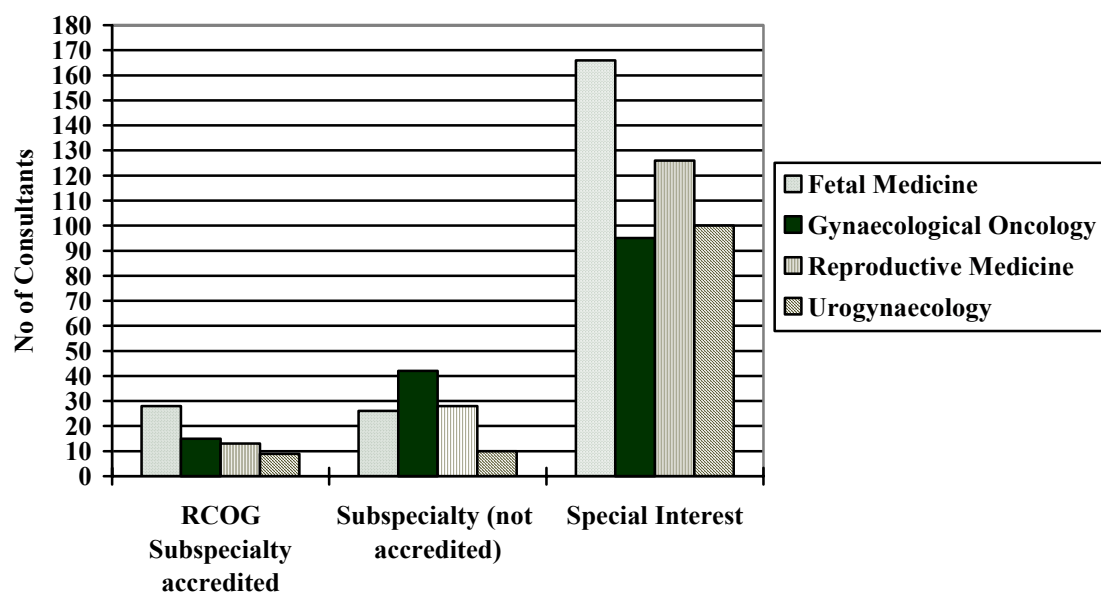

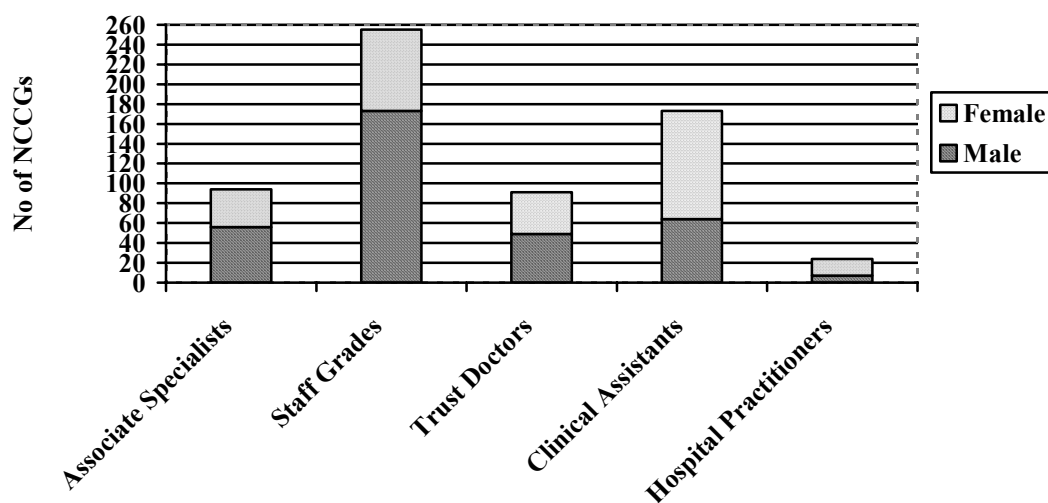
